2021 Legislative Priorities

- Support government structures that provide local decision-making.
- Support continuation of state funding of park districts through established revenue sources, including the State Aid Distribution Fund.
- Support ongoing grant funding for the development and enhancement of outdoor recreation facilities, including the Community Grant Program and the Outdoor Heritage Fund.
- Support the passthrough of federal dollars for parks, recreation, conservation and trails, including the Land and Water Conservation Fund and the Recreational Trails Program.
- Support access for all North Dakotans to physical activity, proper nutrition and healthy lifestyle options through parks, active transportation, healthy foods and recreation programming.
- Support state agency funding and programs that leverage local investment to maximize public parks and recreation opportunities.
- Oppose legislation or unfunded mandates that would be detrimental to parks, recreation and conservation.
