

Randy Bina, executive director of Bismarck Parks and Recreation District (BPRD), was inducted as the 17th member of the NDRPA Hall of Fame.

Previous to being hired as the superintendent of administration at BPRD in 1988, Bina was the superintendent of parks and recreation/recreation director for the Devils Lake Park District. He was the assistant director in Bismarck from 1991 to 2011.

Bina received his undergraduate degree in health, physical education, and recreation from the University of North Dakota in 1979 and his master's degree in management from the University of Mary in 1994. He has held the designation of Certified Parks and Recreation Professional from the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA) since 1990. He is also a Certified Playground Safety Inspector and a Professional in Human Resources.

Bina has been on various NDRPA committees since 1983, serving on the board of directors from 1994-1996 and as president, in 1986-1987 and 2006-2007. He served as a representative from the Midwest Region to the American Park and Recreation Society and the NRPA National Forum, as well as holding leadership positions within the region. Bina served on the NRPA Midwest Regional Council and was chair from 1998-2001. Bina served on NRPA's Board of Directors from 2006-2012.

In 1995, Bina received the NDRPA Fellow Award. He was also the recipient of the 1997 NRPA Midwest Region Fellow Award. In 2004, Bina received the UND Recreation & Leisure Services Program Outstanding Alumnus Award.

Bina was on the North Dakota Prairie Rose State Games Board of Directors from 2004-2011 and has served on the board of directors for the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund since 2009. He is also involved in numerous Bismarck organizations, including the Sertoma Club.

All NDRPA Hall of Fame members are recognized with plaques at the North Dakota Sports Hall of Fame in the Jamestown Civic Center.
