

A police officer since 1992, Eggebraaten has had many different roles during his law enforcement career with the Detroit Lakes (Minnesota) Police Department: Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE) instructor, patrol sergeant, investigative sergeant, K-9 handler, and chief of police. Eggebraaten retired in November 2016 after 25 years in law enforcement and three years as a correctional officer in Clay County, Minn.



Brent Sanford, Sanford Consulting LLC, former ND Lt. Governor & Watford City Mayor

A Watford City native and thirdgeneration business owner, Brent Sanford served as mayor of Watford City from 2010 to 2016 and later as North Dakota's 38th lieutenant

governor.

During his time as mayor, Watford City found itself in the middle of the Bakken oil boom. Large-scale development of horizontal drilling and fracking in the northwest corner of North Dakota brought historic growth to the area. Watford City welcomed newcomers and grew to the size necessary to handle the new energy economy and its new workforce. Community infrastructure investments were required, including parks and recreation facilities and services. Accomplishing that within a five-year window took tremendous collaboration and cooperation among local

community leaders. Sanford will share how the city navigated through this time of immense growth with the help of its partners.

Sanford was selected as North Dakota's 38th lieutenant governor in November 2016. After concluding his service as the lieutenant governor, he founded Sanford Consulting LLC and Sanford Ventures LLC. He has worked with Minnkota Power Cooperative on its Project Tundra – a venture to capture and store carbon beneath North Dakota soil – and with the North Dakota Petroleum Council to bring refugees from Ukraine to work in North Dakota.

COMMISSIONER'S CORNER

Ryan Sott - Hettinger Park Board Commissioner



Ryan Sott had two reasons to actively seek a seat on the local park board after his family settled in Hettinger.

"I have two children (Brody, age 14, and Elizabeth, age 12) that are very athletic," Sott said. "I wanted to make sure they and other children in the community continue to have the great

things that our park and rec has to offer, along with showing my children how or what it takes to maintain such things."

With two active kids, the Cavalier, North Dakota, native and member of the 188th heavy equipment company of the North Dakota Army National Guard, takes a keen interest in making sure all people in Hettinger have diverse recreational opportunities. Sott and the park board oversee six parks.

Hettinger Country Club is a nine-hole public golf course for those who enjoy a day on the links. For those who enjoy a "hole" with chain links, the Hettinger Disc Golf Course awaits, courtesy of a partnership between the park board, the local 4-H club and NDSU's Hettinger Extension Service. It runs along Mirror Lake, a recreational centerpiece in Hettinger.

Mirror Lake is a place to spend a day camping, boating, fishing, birding, hiking, and biking. The district will likely be looking soon at repair or replacement work at the dam. "This will be a very big project for our community," Sott said. "We offer a variety of parks and facilities around town. (But) our main park surrounds Mirror Lake and offers a campground with water and electricity. This is on the south side of town, offering some picture-perfect sunsets and sunrises."



Sott and his family lived in Fargo and Lisbon before settling in Hettinger, a town known for its wrestling program, in 2012. His relationship with the park board began with the youth football program in 2020 and he became a board member in 2022.

When Sott isn't at work for Jacam Catalyst, he's with his wife, Nicole Olson-Sott (who grew up in nearby Reeder), and his kids enjoy the outdoors and competition. Brody wrestles and plays football, and Elizabeth wrestles and plays volleyball. Like many young people in Hettinger, they participate in many recreational pursuits. That keeps Sott and the board busy.

"I would say watching and coaching youth football and enjoying the great outdoors that our parks offer are my most favorite activities," Sott said. "My goal, first and foremost, is to maintain our parks, along with our recreational programs. Budgeting, of course, is always a challenge. However, we are truly grateful for the grant system and our supporting communities."

Sott added networking with other NDRPA members is beneficial to a small district. "It's a great tool to have for questions, guidance and networking," he said. "It is great to see what other communities are doing and how they are doing it."







PARK DISTRICT NEWS

Grand Reopening for Kraft Memorial Field at Oxford Sports Complex

The Grand Forks Park District held a grand reopening for the recently renovated Kraft Memorial Field at Oxford Sports Complex in June.

Fans were treated to free admission for the evening's Grand Forks Legion baseball game, giveaways, free hot dogs, prize drawings, and a special ribbon-cutting ceremony to commemorate the renovated field.

Grand Forks Park District board members and staff, area baseball association members, major project contributors, and family of the field's namesake, Harold "Pinky" Kraft, participated in the ribbon cutting and short program. To kick off the game, Mike Opp, owner of Oxford Reality and major naming donor for the complex's renovation, threw out the ceremonial first pitch.

Through community philanthropy and support from local businesses, families and fans, the Kraft Field Renovation Committee renovated iconic Kraft Memorial Field at Oxford Sports Complex in two phases. Phase I was completed in 2023 and consisted of replacing the infield turf at Montgomery Field. It was funded by a \$366,000 Land & Water Conservation Fund grant, a \$100,000 donation from the Blue Line Club and \$309,000 from the park district budget. After the turf's installation, Montgomery Field hosted the 13U North Dakota state tournament in 2023.

Phase II focused on the new grandstand construction, new bleachers, overhead awning, home and away locker rooms, restrooms, and



concessions stand, as well as the replacement of the infield turf at Kraft Field. In spring 2022, a matching grant through the state of North Dakota for \$605,000 led to the demolition and replacement of the grandstand. Oxford Realty pledged \$500,000 in summer 2022 for the renaming rights of Apollo Sports Complex. The campaign also received \$150,000 from the Blue Line Club and a Garrison Diversion Grant for \$75,000.

The new exterior grandstand structure was completed in fall 2023. Bleachers were installed over the winter months, and the interior of the grandstand was finished last spring. The installation of the new turf was completed in June, just in time for the grand reopening. Future project plans for the complex include outfield turf installation and lighting improvements.

Memorial 4-H Playground Dedicated in Bismarck



Bismarck Parks and Recreation District (BPRD) dedicated the Louise and Loren Gobbs and ElRoy Haadem Memorial 4-H Playground at the Joann Hetzel Memorial 4-H Building on June 20.

Burleigh County 4-H donated the building at the Missouri Valley Complex, 3715 E. Bismarck Expressway to BPRD in early 2021. The indoor space is a popular venue for wedding receptions, nonprofit events and training, and Burleigh County 4-H and NDSU Extension activities.

The playground installation was supported by funding from Burleigh County 4-H, the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District and BPRD.

BisParks BCycle Expands Program Accessibility

In May, Bismarck Parks and Recreation District opened its third season of the BisParks BCycle bike share program with the addition of pedal assist e-bikes. Stations are located at Sertoma Park, Pioneer Park, BSC Aquatic and Wellness Center, and Peace Park in Bismarck.

While classic pedal bikes make up the bulk of BisParks BCycle's fleet, 10 pedal-assist e-bikes have been added this year with support from the Tom and Frances Leach Foundation. E-bikes increase program accessibility for people who are not able to ride a traditional pedal bike. An electric motor and

battery help riders power their bikes. The power assist only works when a rider is pedaling, providing a ride experience like a traditional pedal bike.



Single ride passes may be purchased at each station through the BCycle app. Rates for classic pedal bikes are \$5 plus \$.02 per minute and pedal-assist e-bikes are \$10 plus \$.04 per minute.

2023 NDRPA Outstanding Young Professional Award

Through its annual awards program, the North Dakota Recreation and Park Association recognizes member individuals and organizations who, in the past year, went above and beyond to deliver exceptional programming to the public. The 2023 NDRPA awards were presented at the state conference in September in Grand Forks. More detailed stories are shared in subsequent *FOCUS* magazines.

Dylan Thiem was the recipient of the 2023 NDRPA Outstanding Young Professional award, presented to an NDRPA member 35 years of age or younger who exhibits leadership skills through involvement in local associations, advocacy efforts, community outreach, elected positions within local organizations, and volunteering. They must have achieved accomplishments including awards, commendations, honors, and professional advancement through their work in parks and recreation; and must contribute to the park, recreation, and leisure field in North Dakota.

Thiem has been with the Bismarck Parks and Recreation District (BPRD) since 2012 and was promoted to facility manager in 2021. In his current role, he manages two indoor ice complexes and works with the district's ice partners, including the youth and adult hockey, figure skating and curling clubs. He also oversees three outdoor pools while coordinating lifeguarding and swimming lessons with the district's aquatic specialist.

Thiem currently serves on the

NDRPA Board of Directors as the chair of the Engagement Committee and has been a member of several committees. He was a member of the Bismarck Parks and Recreation District's Risk Management Committee from 2014-2016.

Thiem is always willing to take on additional responsibilities and bring new ideas to the table. He was an integral part of a BPRD team that opened the renovated Hillside Aquatic Complex in 2015. He also researched, proposed and led the implementation of a point-of-sale program at all three outdoor pools that streamlined management of daily admissions and concession sales.

He revamped the preschool ice class, Preschool Skate Date, by updating the program's recreational goals and outcomes. Thiem was also a part of the team that opened the Capital Ice Complex in 2017. When the 2021 American Collegiate Hockey Association Division II Tournament was looking for a site due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the University of Mary approached BPRD to work together to host the event in their community. Theim was an essential member of the team at the Capital Ice Complex that made the event a memorable success.

Thiem's commitment to his profession is exemplary, and he never fails to go the extra mile. On Christmas Eve in 2022, equipment failed at the Capital Ice Complex (CIC) and one sheet of ice was lost at the peak of skating season. Forgoing the holiday with his family, he led his team at CIC to

get ice back up and ready for use in just four days. In Spring 2023, the national lifequard shortage hit home in Bismarck. Thiem tackled the situation head on, working tirelessly to recruit guards and manage available staff to open outdoor pools for the summer, even while down one full-time staff member in his department. In addition, he was actively involved in a project to add a third rink to the VFW Sports Center and provide enhancements to the entire facility. He has done an exceptional job coordinating user groups and planning for the third ice arena at the VFW which opened in February.

In early 2023, Thiem taught a local reporter how to drive a Zamboni for a "Try My Job" TV feature. He is always willing to be interviewed by local media and is a regular guest on the "Park Talk" podcast.

Thiem earned his bachelor's degree in recreation and sports management from St. Cloud State University in Minnesota. He is trained in first aid/CPR and has earned two certifications: Certified Pool Operator and Certified Park and Recreation Professional.



New FLSA Overtime Rule Effective July 1, 2024

On April 26, the Department of Labor (department) finalized updates to regulations under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) regarding exemptions from minimum wage and overtime pay requirements for certain categories of employees.

Effective July 1, the final rule "will increase the standard salary level that helps define and delimit which salaried workers are entitled to overtime pay protections under the FLSA" (Looman, J., What the New Overtime Rule Means for Workers, accessed 2 May 2024 from https://blog.dol.gov/2024/04/23/what-the-new-overtime-rule-means-for-workers).

Full-time salaried workers who meet FLSA requirements and earn less than \$844 per week (\$43,888/year) will be eligible for overtime pay as of July 1, per this new rule.

This new rule also sets future eligibility limits. As of Jan. 1, 2025, full-time salaried workers who meet FLSA requirements and earn \$1,128 per week (\$58,656/year) will be eligible for overtime pay and, starting July 1, 2027, "the eligibility thresholds will be updated every three years, based on current wage data" (Looman, J.).

Additionally, this new rule as of July 1, raises the highly compensated employee (HCE) annual compensation threshold to \$132,964 per year and, as of Jan. 1, 2025, raises the HCE annual compensation threshold to \$151,164 for those who meet FLSA requirements.

Per the department, "employees are exempt from


the Fair Labor Standards Act's minimum wage and overtime protections if they are employed in a bona fide executive, administrative, or professional capacity...

To fall within the EAP [executive, administrative or professional employees] exemption, an employee generally must meet three tests:

- be paid a salary, meaning that they are paid a predetermined and fixed amount that is not subject to reduction because of variations in the quality or quantity of work performed;
- 2. be paid at least a specified weekly salary level; and
- primarily perform executive, administrative, or professional duties, as provided in the Department's regulations." (U.S. Department of Labor, Final Rule: Restoring and Extending Overtime Protections, accessed 2 May 2024).

Overall, this new rule addresses concerns raised by previous approaches to setting salary levels, seeking to strike a balance between ensuring fair compensation for employees and providing flexibility for employers. By aligning salary thresholds with contemporary wage data, the department aims to uphold the integrity of the exemptions while safeguarding against unintended consequences, such as the misclassification of employees.


