

Hazen Park District – Facilities Tour Stops

Antelope Creek Recreation Area

- Antelope Creek RV Park – Hazen’s newest RV park offering 45 sites with water, sewer and 50-amp electricity. There is a comfort station on site with seven full bathrooms with shower and a laundry area. The park is on the north side of Highway 200 just north of Cenex.
- Tennis & Pickleball Courts – There are two lighted tennis/pickleball courts located in the North Star I addition. They have been nicely resurfaced and renovated. The other two courts have been set aside for the use of roller blades and skateboarding.
- Skate Park - located in the Tennis Complex in the North Star I Addition, the skate park offers challenging obstacles for skateboard and rollerblade enthusiasts.

Hazen Dog Park

An off-leash dog park situated in north Hazen. This public park provides a fenced area for dogs to run and play, offering a space for pets to exercise and socialize.

North Star II Park

North Star II Park is Hazen's largest city park and is located on 7.33 acres that border Highway 200. This park offers a large open-air shelter, restroom facilities, sand volleyball courts, playground equipment, a baseball field and fitness equipment, as well as a large open area. A walking/bike path has been paved adjacent to the park.

Each summer, the North Dakota Game and Fish Department stocks rainbow trout in Antelope Creek. There is a mowed fishing area located in the park.

Main Street Corridor

- Christmann Park - located on 12th Avenue West and provides open space areas and playground equipment for youngsters of the community.
- Lewis & Clark RV Park (LCRV) - located on the west side of Hazen, just south of Highway 200 and Main Street, this RV park offers 28 sites with water, sewer and 50-amp electric power. LCRV is a seasonal park open from May through September. There is a comfort station with a washer and dryer, fridge and stove on site.
- Heritage Park - located next to the Hazen Public Library, this park offers a nice play system, a musical playground and an open-air picnic shelter, and some space for large gatherings. It is also the home of "Music in the Park" and “Chalkfest” each summer.

Northeast Recreation Cluster

- John Moses Park - one of Hazen's oldest parks boasting well established evergreen and shade trees. This park is located very close to the Hazen Outdoor Swimming Pool just east of Hazen High School. The park is named for Governor John Moses who spent many years in Hazen and was intricate in the early development of the community. He served as the 22nd Governor of North Dakota from 1939-1945 and as a United State Senator in 1945.
- Hazen Swimming Pool & Waterslides - popular outdoor facility featuring a 165-foot waterslide, diving board and zero entry play area. The facility is typically open from June through August. The facility offers open swimming, family swim, swimming lessons, and lap swim.
- Mautz Field & Miller Field - Primarily used for baseball and softball activities, and other local field sports

Slinde Field

Home of high school, American Legion and Babe Ruth Baseball. Slinde Field has a unique turf/agri infield design.

North Stars Arena

Indoor venue for hockey, skating, and year-round community activities. The facility has a large spectator area, concession stand and heated viewing area.

Hazen Bay
